## Parkinson's disease

Parkinson's disease (PD) the first is neurodegenerative disease effectively ameliorated by neurotransmitter replacement therapy subsequently neurotransmitter agonist therapy. Sterotaxic surgery also pioneered with Parkinson's and has resulted in major therapuetic advances. Doctors Factor and Weiner have assembled an international team of contributors to provide the reader with an up-to-date review on the multiple aspects of the disease through 9 sections covering clinical presentation, behavioral and psychiatric and neurochemistry, manifestations, pathology pathogenesis, etiology and diagnosis, drugs, surgery treatment issues, subtyes and parkinsonism as the core of the book. These topics are bracketed in the begining by a section on history starting with James Parkinson's famous essay. At the end there is a section on social issues that concern PD patients. In the history section, Goetz in chapter 3 points out, it was Charcot who was able to separate PD from other diseases with termor and gait disorders.

The next 2 sections comprising of 15 chapters provide a clinical description of PD including nonmotor complaints such as sensory symptoms, speech dysfunction and sleep disorders. Also the relationship of PD to Alzheimers' disease and demential with Lewy bodies is addressed. association of PD with a variety of psychatric disorders are discussed in chapters 17-19. The pathology and neurochemistry of PD are covered in section 4, chapters 20-23. In section 5, chapter 24, the problems with diagnosis from a clinical and pathological standpoint are discussed, while the following 2 chapters discuss imaging technology. Many aspects of therapy are extensively treated in this text, discussed in detail in Chapters 32-50. (Sections 2, 8 and 9) including Levodopa, Amantadine and Anticholingerics. agonists, atypical antipsychotic, protective therapy, sterotactic pallidotomy and thalamatomy deep brain stimulation and neural transplants. The differential diagnosis of PD is very large. Section 10 reviews in 4 chapters these disorders that are most important including Parkinson's plus syndrome symptomatic parkinsonism.

This mongraphy not only provides practical treatment approaches, but also serves as a testament to the state of knowledge about Parkinson's disease at the beginning of the 21st century. This book is a excellent buy not only to movement disorder specialists but also to Neurologists, Neuroscience researchers and Neurology residents. This book is also useful for Gerontologists, Neurosurgeons and Neuropsychologists.

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
