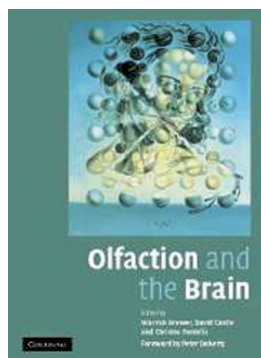


Book Review
