


## Book Review



### Physical illness and schizophrenia: a review of the evidence

In the preface, it is mentioned that this is the first comprehensive and systemic review on the prevalence of physical diseases in schizophrenic patients. For this, the authors searched MEDLINE to look for this relation. The authors include most of the known physical diseases, and they make their finding for each disease and its relation to schizophrenia and they concluded

that there is an increased prevalence of some physical illness in schizophrenic patients such as cardiovascular disease, obesity, diabetes, and other metabolic disease while the comorbidity with others is still there, but to a lesser degree.

It includes a lot of tables to clarify the studies for specific physical illness and the prevalence of schizophrenia among them, for example, obstetric complications, and a risk of cardiovascular disease in patients with schizophrenia, which helps the reader. It is a good effort and review on this subject and generally, it is useful for psychiatric resident and psychiatrists mainly who work in consultation psychiatric surfaces.
